CONSUMPTION OR KINSHIP?

During this past summer you may have noticed that we've been reading through the book of Romans (Paul's masterpiece) during the second lesson on Sunday morning. And on July 23 we heard Paul talk about how "all creation is groaning." Maybe those words to for you, given everything we've experienced this summer with the wildfires in our

popped out for you, given everything we've experienced this summer with the wildfires in our province. Creation is groaning indeed!

I read an article recently by Brian Bantum, a professor of theology. He talked about how our North American lifestyle of (over)consumption is contributing greatly to the groaning of creation. He writes, "I feel like I can hear those groans Paul talks about when I open my garage to begin some spring-cleaning and am almost toppled by piles of boxes and balled up plastic bags that never made their way back to the store. A few minutes later I give up and sit in the sun, scrolling on my phone, hovering over a new pair of shoes in my size and favorite color, rationalizing why I could click "Add to cart."... Wait for a little dollop of joy to arrive on my doorstep, and let the world melt away for a moment. And creation groans."

Interestingly he notes how part of our problem as Christians lies in our misunderstanding of Paul when Paul says that to set the mind on the flesh is death and to set the mind on the spirit is life (July 16). Too often however we equate "flesh" with the material stuff of this world. That leads to an attitude that says since stuff is really ungodly we don't have to care about how we use it.

But in fact, he claims, "flesh" is best understood as ego, or a conception of the self unrelated to others. In other words to live in the flesh is to live as if only we matter and everything else is disposable. That's deadly! Life in the spirit, on the other hand, is "to see our interconnectedness, our kinship" with the material world. Kinship recognizes that we live in relationship with all other created things. Consumption encourages us to see ourselves over against other things.

What difference does that make? As he says, "I have come to take great satisfaction in repurposing things. It is a strangely spiritual practice—repurposing, making new, letting the things that were seemingly broken become the means to repair...maybe a life in the Spirit is more about the nurture and care with which we tend to what we already have."

Through the month of September we are celebrating the Season of Creation. Maybe one of the ways we can do that is by practicing a little repurposing ourselves.



Rostered leaders who have accepted a new call or moved into a new area of ministry:



Regulation Certification

We are hoping to put together a list of members who have either Level 1 First Aid Certification and/or Food Safe BC Certification.

Most Ushers do not have any First Aid certification (and nor is this mandatory in order to volunteer). However, in an emergency most congregants would look to the Ushers as first responders...yet most could only dial 911 like anyone else. If there are people within the congregation who have their Level 1 First Aid certification and who would be willing to take charge in an emergency event, please let either the Pastor or the office know who you are.

Similarly, the Fraser Health Authority is now performing a Food Safe inspection of our kitchen. We have met all guideline requirements so far, but should regulations change in the future and a Food Safe BC certification be required at future events where food is served, we'd like to know who you are if you are currently Food Safe Certified. Online certification is possible and through a generous offer a limited number of bursaries for certification are currently available should you have an interest in getting certified yourself...



Season of Creation 2023 Let Justice and Peace Flow

This is an invitation to join with Christians around the world calling for Justice; not only for humans, but for all creation. Our climate and ecological emergency causes the most hurt to vulnerable nations, especially those who have contributed the fewest carbon emissions.

At COP 27 a victory was made by Global South Nations for wealthier nations to provide financing for loss and damage. This has taken more than 30 years of working together to accomplish.

At this year's biodiversity conference, COP 15, some hopeful steps were also taken with the new UN "Treaty on Oceans", to protect marine biodiversity in international waters. And, Canada, along with many other countries has committed to protecting 30% of both land and water by 2030.

Unfortunately, while individual actions are very important, they are no longer enough. We, as faith communities can call on our governments to:

- Keep 1.5 degrees alive;
- Reach binding global agreements that achieve a fair and equitable energy transition away from fossil fuels;
- Protect biodiversity;
- Allocate fair funding for loss and damages to vulnerable nations.

To achieve Peace on Earth, we must achieve peace with the Earth, and each other. This will require Justice.


