We are united with all the baptized in the one body of Christ, the church, anointed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, and joined in God's mission for the life of the world. Living with Christ and in the community of God's people, we grow in faith, love, and obedience to the will of God.

Mogens and Lily: I present Eva Yifan Liu / Ike Yike Liu for baptism.

Kate: I present Sammie Xiangchan Sun for baptism.

P: Ike, Eva, Sammie called by the Holy Spirit, trusting in the grace and love of God, do you desire to be baptized into Christ?

Each candidate responds: I do.

P: Shanhui and Sammie, as Ike and Eva receive the gift of baptism, we entrust you with responsibilities: to live with them among God's faithful people, bring them to the word of God and the holy supper, teach them the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments, place in their hands the holy scriptures, and nurture them in faith and prayer, so that they may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace.

Do you promise to help Ike and Eva grow in the Christian faith and life?

Response: I do.

P: Mogens, Lily, and Kate, do you promise to nurture Ike, Eva, and Sammie in the Christian faith as you are empowered by God's Spirit, and to help them live in the covenant of baptism and in communion with the church?

Response: I do.

P: People of God, do you promise to support Ike and Eva and Sammie, and pray for them in their new life in Christ?

C: **We do.**

P: Only by God's grace can we renounce the forces of evil and the power of sin and confess our faith in the triune God.

Ike and Eva, do you say "No" to all the things that pull you away from God?

Ike and Eva: I say "No".

P: Sammie, Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God, the powers of this world that rebel against God, and the ways of sin that draw you from God?

Sammie: I renounce them.

P: Ike and Eva, do you say "Yes" to God who promises to love you always and forever?

Ike and Eva: I say "Yes".

P: Sammie, together with all the people of God present here, do you believe in God the Father?





First Reading: Isaiah 2:1-5

The visionary message presented in this reading focuses on a future day when God establishes a universal reign of peace. Divine decisions will make war obsolete, and the worshiping community responds: "Let us walk in the light of that Lord now!"

Second Reading: Romans 13:11-14

Paul compares the advent of Christ to the coming of dawn. We live our lives today in light of Christ's coming in the future.

Besides this, you know what time it is, how it is now the moment for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we became believers; the night is far gone, the day is near. Let us then lay aside the works of darkness and put on the armour of light; let us live honourably as in the day, not in revelling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarrelling and jealousy. Instead, put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.

Gospel Reading: Matthew 24:36-44

Jesus describes his second coming as a sudden, turbulent event that will bring about deep change to our normal, day-to-day lives. Therefore, he urges people to stay awake, be aware, and wait expectantly, because the Son of Man will come unannounced.

[Jesus said to the disciples] But about that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. For as the days of Noah were, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day Noah entered the ark, and they knew nothing until the flood came and swept them all away, so too will be the coming of the Son of Man. Then two will be in the field; one will be taken and one will be left. Two women will be grinding meal together; one will be taken and one will be left. Keep awake therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. But understand this: if the owner of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into. Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour.
